

## Preparing for Meaningful Use Registration

For both programs: If you are registering on behalf of a provider, you will need to create a log in and password on [www.cms.gov/Regulations-and-Guidance/Legislation/EHRIncentivePrograms/RegistrationandAttestation.html](http://www.cms.gov/Regulations-and-Guidance/Legislation/EHRIncentivePrograms/RegistrationandAttestation.html). Please wait approximately 24 hours before finishing FEDERAL registration.

### Medicare Incentive Program

Federal Registration (<https://ehrincentives.cms.gov>). Please have the following readily available:

- ✓ NPI #
- ✓ NPPES login and password. If you don't know these, call 1-800-465-3203 (NPI toll free).
- ✓ TIN—Tax ID number
- ✓ Product Certification Number (if possible). This is not needed at registration, but it will be needed for attestation. We advise you to add the certification number to the registration, so you will not have to backtrack later.
- ✓ Certified product numbers can be found here: <http://onc-chpl.force.com/ehrcert>.

### Medicaid Incentive Program

Medicaid providers must register at the federal level first (<https://ehrincentives.cms.gov>), and then must wait at least 24 hours before registering at the state level. Step-by-step user guides will be provided.

- ✓ NPPES log in and password. If you don't know these, call 1-800-465-3203 (NPI toll free).
- ✓ TIN
- ✓ Product Certification Number (if possible). This is not needed at registration, but it will be needed for attestation. We advise you to add the certification number to the registration, so you will not have to backtrack later.
